As required by the CRRSAA Act and in compliance with guidance from the U.S. Department of Education, Fresno Pacific University reports its use of the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

- Fresno Pacific University signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education its Certification and Agreement that the university has used, or intends to use, no less than than the amount of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under CRRSAA.
- 2. Fresno Pacific University has or will receive \$2,060,779 from the U.S. Department of Education for CRRSAA Act Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students (HEERF II).
- As of December 31, 2021, Fresno Pacific University had disbursed \$2,060,779 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants (HEERF II) to students. Of this amount, \$173,669 was disbursed as American Rescue Plan Grants (HEERF III).
- 4. Fresno Pacific University estimates the number of students in Spring 2021 eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CRRSAA Act to be 3,180.
- 5. Fresno Pacific University estimates the number of students in Fall 2021 eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CRRSAA Act to be 3,521.
- 6. 2805 (duplicated) students have been awarded Emergency Financial Aid Grants in amounts ranging from \$130 to \$4,000 as of December 31, 2021.
- 7. Method of Awarding of Emergency Financial Aid Grants:

Spring 2021 Student Assistance Grants

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents as determined by a submitted 20/21 or 19/20 FAFSA (this requirement has been rescinded)
- Enrolled in 1 or more units in a degree or credential program in Spring 21, Summer 21, Fall 21
- Funds are meant to cover components of the Cost of Attendance (Tuition + Fees, Books, Living Expenses, Food, Transportation, etc.), or expenses related or incurred due to COVID-19.

Awarding Assumptions:

- Priority is given to students with demonstrated high financial need
 - o Zero-EFC students
 - o Pell-eligible students
 - EFCs <= 10,000
 - o Cal Grant Recipients
 - Grad Students with an EFC in the 0 10,000 range
- Students whose Modified Financial Need¹ (MFN) falls in the 2nd and 3rd quartiles (TUG/DC/CRED only). Provides funding for those outside Pell range but still have high need.²
- Students with a Modified Unmet Need³ (MUN) > 0
- Students with a balance due need additional support to assist with retention
- Priority for funds should be given to full-time students

¹ Modified Financial Need (MFN) = COA – EFC – Pell - Cal Grant – Institutional Aid ² Need Modifier = Assists students who are not Pell-eligible but still have significant Modified Financial Need. Assigns 1 point to those with an MFN between the 25th and 75th percentile. Students in the first quartile are mostly Pell-eligible and are likely receiving extra points based on their lower EFC. Students with Low EFC (5712-10,000) may be eligible if their MFN is in the percentile range.

³ Modified Unmet Need (MUN) = COA – EFC – Inst Aid

Ken Isaak – Additional Emergency Student Assistance Grants

Students who submit a Ken Isaak Request form are evaluated based upon whether their circumstances describe items in the Cost of Attendance or costs related to the COVID-19 pandemic. If the Ken Isaak Request is approved, an Emergency Student Assistance Grant of up to \$1,000 is awarded to the student. The university is currently limiting students to one additional grant.

Edquity Emergency Assistance Grants

Students who submit an Emergency Assistance Grant through the Edquity platform are evaluated using a research-based scoring algorithm to determine level of need for items in the Cost of Attendance or costs related to the COVID-19 pandemic. If the Emergency Assistance Grant is approved, an Emergency Student Assistance Grant of \$500 or \$1,000 is awarded to the student. The university is currently limiting students to one additional grant per semester.

ARPA Grant – Student Assistant Grants

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be enrolled in a degree or credential program for 1 or more units in Fall 2021.
- Funds are meant to cover components of the Cost of Attendance (Tuition + Fees, Books, Living Expenses, Food, Transportation, etc.), or expenses related or incurred due to COVID-19.

Awarding Priority

- Awarding is based upon the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and the number of units in which they are enrolled as of October 1, 2021. Students who do not have an EFC on file are awarded a base amount depending upon the units in which they are enrolled.
- Award amounts increase as the EFC decreases and the number of units increase thus awarding higher grant amounts to students with higher financial need and cost of tuition. Additionally, higher overall awards are given to undergraduate and credential students versus graduate students as grad students are ineligible for Pell funds. According about 80% of the funds expended are designated to students who have an EFC in the Pell-eligible range.

Award Amounts

- Award amounts for Fall 2021 varied between \$140 and \$2,180 per student.

Students who choose to apply their grant directly to their student account will receive priority in processing.

The deadline to submit your Assistance Grant Consent Form is Friday, April 9, 2021. Unclaimed grants will be forfeited and redistributed to other students.

Your Student Assistance Grant is to be used to pay for your cost of attending Fresno Pacific University including tuition and fees, books, food, personal necessities, housing, transportation and childcare, or expenses related to the Coronavirus.

Your grant eligibility was determined based upon the requirements of CRRSAA, guidance from the U.S. Department of Education and criteria developed by Fresno Pacific University. Selected recipients are U.S. citizens or permanent residents, have a 2020-2021 FAFSA on file at FPU and were enrolled in at least one unit during the spring 2021 semester as of February 4, 2021. Additional items taken into consideration include the program of study, student account balance,

current enrollment status and financial need. Priority for funding was given to students with the highest demonstrated financial need, including those eligible for a Pell Grant.
